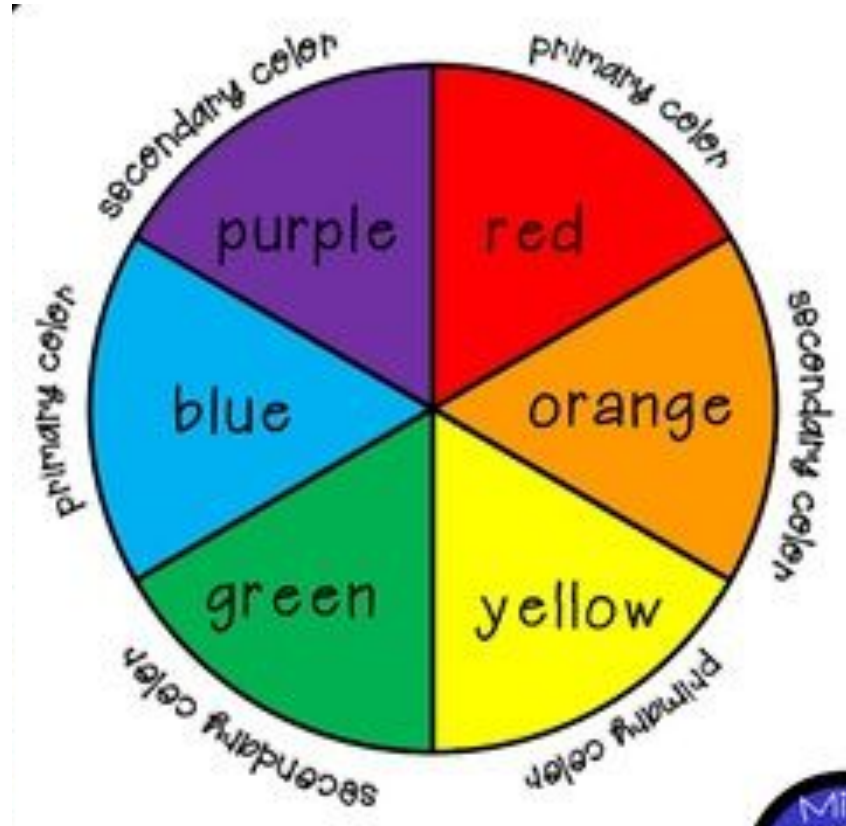
Let's review the **Color Wheel!**

The first 3 colors are called the **Primary Colors:**

Red, **Yellow**, **Blue**

The second 3 colors are called the **Secondary Colors:**

Orange, **Green**, **Purple**

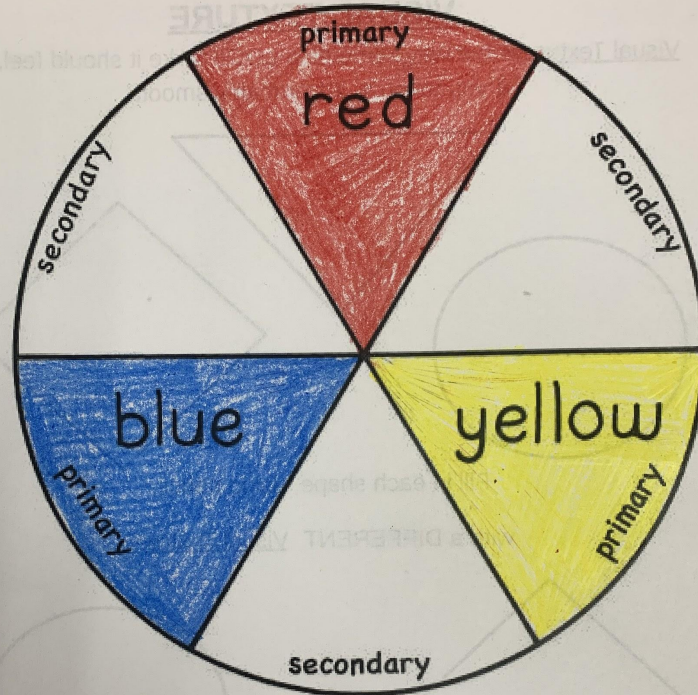

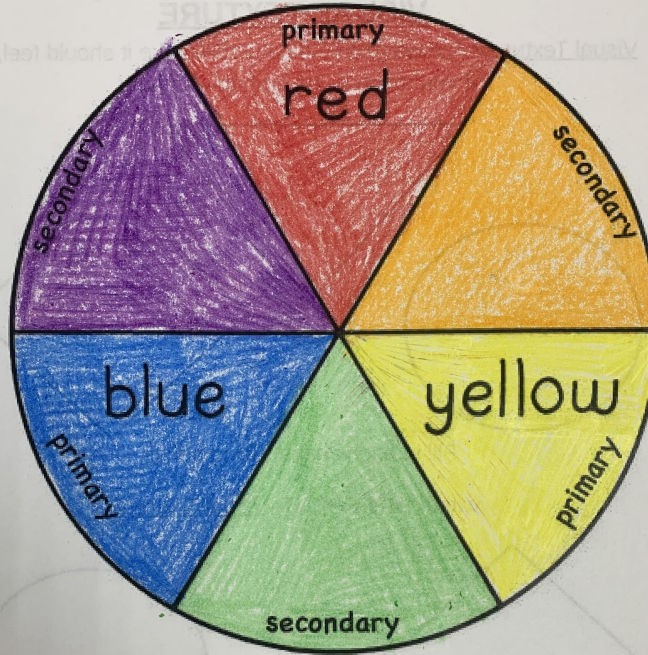
